I like the book very much; the book's strength appears to be in its ability to integrate the various aspects of data fusion into one cohesive whole. Your fundamental organizing structure into Introduction, Common Representational Format, Data Fusion and Management is quite appealing. (I would appreciate seeing a copy of Chapter 6 – "Time Propagation"; this is a topic I am working on and would greatly profit.)

The style of the book is quite good; in particular, I like the way that the examples are very liberally used. From the beginning, every new concept is almost immediately introduced first by a statement, then by an example. This makes for very easy reading.

The level appears appropriate for a graduate course on data fusion. To be blunt, when the book is ready, I would like to build such a course based on it at Ben-Gurion University.

I can see that a lot of work went into it!! Good luck on having it published.
